MCOLES Basic Police Training Concentration
Program and Course Equivalency Guide for Kellogg Community College (2010 – 2011)

The Bachelor of Science in Liberal Studies with MCOLES Basic Police Training requires at least 120 semester hours of coursework. It is a joint program between Miller College and Kellogg Community College, designed for the student planning to enter the field of Law Enforcement. The student completes his/her first year (31 semester hours) at Kellogg Community College. The second and third years (51 semester hours) are completed at Miller College. The fourth year (38 semester hours) consists of MCOLES approved Basic Police Training School and is completed at Kellogg Community College. A student completing this program will complete MCOLES Basic Police Training and will earn an Associate of Applied Science degree from Kellogg Community College and a Bachelor of Science degree from Miller College. In keeping with the College Mission, students are expected to complete one hour of service learning for every hour they are enrolled at Miller College. Service learning may be performed at any time prior to completion of the Senior Seminar. *The purpose of this guide is to outline this degree program's requirements for the catalog year noted above. Please be aware that your catalog year and requirements are determined by the first semester in which you actually take classes at Miller College.*
